CONSENT AGREEMENT IN TERMS OF SECTION 49D AS READ WITH SECTIONS 58(1)(a)(iii) AND 58(1)(b) OF THE COMPETITION ACT, NO. 89 OF 1998 (AS AMENDED), BETWEEN THE COMPETITION COMMISSION AND CORPCOM OUTDOOR (PTY) LTD IN RESPECT OF A CONTRAVENTION OF SECTION 4(1)(b)(i) OF THE COMPETITION ACT, NO. 89 OF 1998.

The Competition Commission and Corpcom Outdoor (Pty) Ltd hereby agree that an application be made to the Competition Tribunal for the confirmation of this Consent Agreement as an order of the Tribunal in terms of Section 49D as read with Sections 58(1)(a)(iii) and 58(1)(b) of the Competition Act, No. 89 of 1998, as amended, in respect of contraventions of section 4(1)(b)(i) of the Act, on the terms set out below.

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1. DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Consent Agreement the following definitions shall apply:

- 1.1 "Act" means the Competition Act, No. 89 of 1998, as amended;
- 1.2 "Accredited Media Agents" means advertising agents endorsed by MCC through Corex that have provided security to MCC. MCC holds securities for its members (media owners) on behalf of an Accredited Media Agency.
- 1.3 "Black People" bears the same meaning as that set out in section 1 of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act 53 of 2003 as amended;
- 1.4 "Commission" means the Competition Commission of South Africa, a statutory body established in terms of section 19 of the Act, with its principal business address at 1st Floor, Mulayo Building (Block C), the DTI Campus, 77 Meintjies Street, Sunnyside, Pretoria, Gauteng;
- 1.5 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Commission, appointed in terms of section 22 of the Act;
- 1.6 "Complaint" means the complaint initiated by the Commissioner in terms of section 49B(1) of the Act under case numbers 2011Nov5779, 2015Dec0695 and 2017Oct0028;
- 1.7 "Consent Agreement" means this Agreement duly signed and concluded between the Commission and Corpcom Outdoor;

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- 1.8 "CoreX" means Corexalance Proprietary Limited, a company duly incorporated under the laws of the Republic of South Africa with its principal place of business at Building A, Office 103, Cresta Junction, Cnr of Beyers Naude and Judges Street, Cresta, Gauteng:
- "Corpcom Outdoor" means Corpcom Outdoor Proprietary Limited, 1.9 registration number 1989/007553/07, a company duly incorporated under the laws of the Republic of South Africa with its principal place of business at 392 Main Road, Bryanston, 2191;
- 1.10 "Economic Development Fund" means the fund referred to in paragraph 7.2 below:
- 1.11 "JCDecaux" means JCDecaux South Africa Proprietary Limited, registration number 2008/015266/07, a company duly incorporated under the laws of the Republic of South Africa with its principal place of business at 392 Main Road, Bryanston, 2191, (formerly known as Continental Outdoor Media (Pty) Ltd. ("Continental");
- 1.12 "MDDA" means Media Development and Diversity Agency, a juristic person established in terms of section 2 of the Media Development and Diversity Agency Act no 14 of 2002, as amended, with its principal place business address at 1st Floor, 5 St Davids Place, Parktown, Johannesburg, Gauteng:
- 1.13 "MCC" means the Media Credit Co-ordinators, a non-profit company duly incorporated under the laws of the Republic of South Africa with its principal place of business at Building A, Office 103, Cresta Junction, Cnr of Beyers Naude and Judges Street, Cresta, Gauteng:

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- 1.14 "MCC Members" means media owners that have subscribed to MCC and are active in the provision of advertising space;
- 1.15 "Qualifying Small Agencies" means media or media related agencies or organisations with a turnover not exceeding R50 000 000 (fifty million Rand) and which are majority owned by Black People; and
- 1.16 "Tribunal" means the Competition Tribunal of South Africa, a statutory body established in terms of section 26 of the Act, with its principal place of business at 1st Floor, Mulayo Building (Block C), the DTI Campus, 77 Meintjies Street, Sunnyside, Pretoria, Gauteng;

2. THE COMMISSION'S INVESTIGATION AND FINDINGS

- 2.1 In November 2011, the Commission initiated a complaint in terms of section 49(B)(1) of the Act (under case number 2011Nov5779) against Avusa Media Limited, Caxton Community Newspapers Limited, Independent Newspapers Proprietary Limited, Media24 Limited, Radmark Proprietary Limited (collectively, the "respondents") and MCC.
- 2.2 In December 2015 (under case number 2015Dec0695) the Commission expanded the initial complaint to include 24 additional respondents.
- 2.3 The allegations against the respondents are that:
 - 2.3.1 through the medium of the MCC, the respondents agreed to offer similar discounts and payment terms to advertising agencies that place advertisements with MCC members. For accredited agencies, the

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- discount offered is 16.5% for all payments made within 45 days of the date of the statement while for the most part the discount offered to non-accredited agencies is 15% for payments made within the same period.
- 2.3.2 The respondents as members of the MCC employ services of an intermediary company called Corex to perform the risk assessments on advertising agencies for purposes of imposing the above settlement discount structure and terms on advertising agencies.
- 2.3.3 The Commission found that the above-mentioned practices by the respondents gave rise to a restriction of competition amongst competing respondents in that they did not independently determine an element of a price in the form of discount or trading terms. These practices amount to price fixing and the fixing of trading conditions in contraventions of section 4(1)(b)(i) of the Act.
- 2.4 The Commission also found that on 14 December 2009, the business of Corpcom Outdoor was transferred to Continental. Following its acquisition by the JCDecaux group on 18 June 2015, Continental changed its name to JCDecaux on 10 May 2016. Corpcom Outdoor, however remains an entity within the same group as JCDecaux and continues to hold assets but has limited business activities.
- 2.5 Prior to Corpcom Outdoor becoming a member of the JCDecaux group it engaged in the practices referred to in paragraph 2 above and it has undertaken to pay the administrative penalty.

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3. ADMISSION OF LIABILITY

Corpcom Outdoor admits that it engaged in the practices set out in clause 2 above in contravention of section 4(1)(b)(i) of the Act until 2009.

4. CO-OPERATION

Insofar as the Commission is aware, Corpcom Outdoor:

- 4.1 has provided the Commission with truthful and timely disclosure, including information in its possession or under its control, relating to the prohibited practice;
- 4.2 has provided full and expeditious co-operation to the Commission concerning the prohibited practice;
- 4.3 has ceased to engage in the prohibited practice;
- 4.4 has not destroyed, falsified or concealed information, evidence and documents relating to the prohibited practice; and
- 4.5 has not misrepresented or made a wilful or negligent misrepresentation concerning the material facts of any prohibited practice or otherwise acted dishonestly.

FUTURE CONDUCT

Corpcom Outdoor agrees and undertakes to:

5.1 provide the Commission with full and expeditious and reasonable co-operation from the time the Consent Agreement is concluded until the subsequent proceedings in the Tribunal or the Competition Appeal Court are completed.


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This includes, but is not limited to:

- 5.1.1 to the extent that it is in existence and has not yet been provided, providing evidence, written or otherwise, which is in its possession or under its control, concerning the contraventions in this Consent Agreement; and availing its employees to testify as witnesses for the Commission in any cases regarding the contraventions contained in this Consent Agreement:
- 5.1.2 prepare and circulate a statement summarising the content of this agreement to its employees, managers and directors within 30 (thirty) days of the date of confirmation of this Consent Agreement as an order of the Tribunal:
- 5.1.3 refrain from engaging in conduct which contravenes section 4(1)(b) of the Act, and from engaging in any prohibited practice in future;
- 5.1.4 develop, implement and monitor a competition law compliance programme as part of its corporate governance policy, which is designed to ensure that its employees, management, directors and agents do not engage in future contraventions of the Act. In particular, such compliance programme should include mechanisms for the identification, prevention, detection and monitoring of any contravention of the Act:
- 5.1.5 submit a copy of such compliance programme to the Commission within 60 (sixty) days of the date of confirmation of the Consent Agreement as an order by the Tribunal;



6. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY

6.1 Having regard to the provisions of sections 58(1)(a)(iii) as read with sections

59(1)(a), 59(2) and 59(3) of the Act, Corpcom Outdoor is liable to pay an

administrative penalty.

6.2 Corpcom Outdoor agrees and undertakes to pay an administrative penalty in

the amount of R1,389,438 (one million three hundred eighty-nine thousand

four hundred and thirty-eight Rand), which does not exceed 10% (ten

percent) of Corpcom Outdoor's annual turnover in the Republic of South Africa

for the financial year ended 2016.

6.3 The payment shall be made within 30 (thirty) days of the confirmation of the

Consent Agreement as an order of the Tribunal.

6.4 The administrative penalty shall be paid into the Commission's bank account,

6.5 The administrative penalty will be paid over by the Commission to the National

Revenue Fund in accordance with section 59(4) of the Act.

OTHER REMEDIES

7.1 SMALL AGENCY PARTICIPATION

- 7.1.1 Although JCDecaux did not engage in the practices set out in clause 2 above, solely in the spirit of co-operation with the Commission and recognising that Corpcom Outdoor remains an entity within the same group as JCDecaux with limited business activity, JCDecaux agrees on behalf of Corpcom Outdoor, to:
- 7.1.1.1 offer, and where accepted by Qualifying Small Agencies, provide 25% (twenty five percent) in bonus advertising space on roadside digital or roadside static advertising inventory to Qualifying Small Agencies. The bonus advertising space will be utilised at times scheduled at the discretion of JCDecaux, which discretion shall be reasonably exercised, taking into account the nature of the advertising medium on which the advertising space is purchased, the advertising space package purchased, the target audience and advertising requirements of the clients of Qualifying Small Agencies. JCDecaux will offer these terms for a period of 3 (three) years from the date of confirmation of this Consent Agreement, as an order of the Tribunal, subject to a total annual advertising space cap of R1,000,000 (one million Rand) with a cumulative cap over 3 (three) years of R3,000,000 (three million Rand).
- 7.1.1.2 publish the terms in paragraph 7.1.1.1 of the Consent Agreement using national media that has a reach to Qualifying Small Agencies within 10 (ten) business days from the date of confirmation of this

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


Consent Agreement as an order of the Tribunal, inviting all Qualifying Small Agencies to participate. JCDecaux will thereafter publish these terms every year on the anniversary of the first publication for a further period of 2 (two) years.

- 7.1.1.3 provide the Commission with a written report in respect of the utilisation of the 25% bonus advertising space by Qualifying Small Agencies. Such report shall include information on the number of Qualifying Small Agencies who have utilised the bonus advertising space, as well as the names, contact details and the Rand value of the bonus advertising space received by each Qualifying Small Agency.
- 7.1.1.4 submit such report 1 (one) month after every 6 (six) month period from the date of confirmation of this Consent Agreement, for a period of 3 (three) years.

7.2 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND

- 7.2.1 Corpcom Outdoor undertakes to contribute R 500 198.00 (five hundred thousand one hundred and ninety-eight Rand) to the Economic Development Fund to enable the development of qualifying beneficiaries.
- 7.2.2 This contribution will be made in 3 (three) equal annual instalments of R166,732.67 (one hundred and sixty-six thousand, seven hundred and thirty-two Rand and sixty-seven cents), the first contribution is



payable within 3 (three) months of the date of confirmation of this Consent Agreement by the Tribunal and thereafter by no later than the first and second anniversary of the first contribution.

7.2.3 These contributions shall be made into an account created and managed by MDDA, which account details are as follows:

7.2.4 The qualifying beneficiaries are Black People and include the following:

7.2.4.1 students requiring bursaries to study media or advertising qualifications at tertiary institutions;

7.2.4.2 individuals requiring assistance to acquire necessary postqualifications experience to participate in the advertising industry;

7.2.4.3 individuals requiring assistance with sponsorship for mentoring or training in areas of media and/or advertising


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- 7.2.4.4 black owned small media or advertising agencies requiring assistance with start-up capital;
- 7.2.5 The Economic Development Fund will be managed and administered by MDDA and will be subject to annual audits by an auditing firm. MDDA shall submit an audited report relating to the management and administration of the activities of the Economic Development Fund to the Commission within 3 (three) months of the completion of the audit.
- 7.2.6 In addition, the MDDA shall provide the Commission with a written report in respect of the utilisation of the contributions made by Corpcom Outdoor to the Economic Development Fund, including the number of qualifying beneficiaries who derived benefits from such contributions, as well as the names, contact details and the Rand value of the benefits received by qualifying beneficiaries. Such report shall be submitted every 6 (six) months for a period of 3 (three) years.
- 7.2.7 In accordance with clause 4.1 of the MDDA agreement, MDDA shall publish the terms in paragraph 7.2 of this Consent Agreement using national media that has a reach to qualifying beneficiaries within 3 (three) months from the date of confirmation of this Consent Agreement as an order of the Tribunal.

8. FULL AND FINAL SETTLEMENT



This agreement is entered into in full and final settlement of all allegations under case numbers CR294Feb18 ,2011Nov5779, 2015Dec0695 and 2017Oct0028 and, upon confirmation as an order by the Tribunal, concludes all proceedings between the Commission, Corpcom Outdoor, JCDecaux and their subsidiaries, affiliates and divisions in South Africa under those case numbers.
